## Open Carry Effective Jan 1, 2016

The Bill signed by Governor Abbott allowing open carry in Texas will become effective January 1, 2016. Texans will still need a license to carry openly. The course for concealed carry is being modified accordingly and the Concealed Handgun License will be renamed Handgun License. Those people who have a Concealed Handgun License do not need to do anything before the renewal date.

Whether you choose to carry openly or concealed is a personal choice. There are pros and cons concerning both. However, one thing that is highly recommended is to be proficient with the handgun you carry. You cannot practice too much. Things such as being able to draw the gun without having to look at the holster, proper grip on the gun, sight alignment which is a product of proper grip, trigger squeeze, are all crucial things that you should do without having to think about them.

Even more crucial is your mind set. Know before you get in a situation how you want to react. At what point should I draw a gun? Does the other person have a gun or are they just acting in a hostile manner? Whether the other person has a gun will greatly affect how you react. After I've drawn a gun, then what? Should I take cover, back away, run as fast as I can? Or should I shoot? And everyone needs to determine if they can pull the trigger with the gun pointed at another person. Many people think they can do that easily. But most will hesitate, and start thinking. And if the other person is armed, that hesitation may be very costly.

Whatever your choice of gun and how you carry it, you should be proficient with the gun and think ahead of time how you want to react. Hopefully, none of us will ever be placed in a situation where we need a gun to defend ourselves. But if placed in such a situation, think ahead about what you might want to do.
